



Helleborus Ivory Prince

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Handsome, blue green foliage with an abundance of ivory blooms, streaked with rose and chartreuse, makes this Hellebore a highly desirable plant in the border and in a container. Ivory Prince has attractive foliage through all seasons with a tidy, compact growth habit. Flowers are pink in bud, open face up, and last for several months.

USES

Because Ivory Prince blooms from January through April, it's outstanding for a winter and early spring show of flowers. It can be planted in borders, partly shaded rockeries or containers.

GARDENER TIPS

- Plant in light shade with protection from severe weather.
- Plant in fertile, humus-rich, moist, well-drained soil.
- Water generously.
- Mulch in the fall in cold winter areas.
- Remove older, shabby leaves to keep plant looking fresh.
- Cut back flowers when fully faded.
