



Echinacea Crazy Pink™

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

We are amazed by the multitude of clear pink, lightly fragrant blooms with dark green, compact foliage. A day-neutral variety, Crazy Pink blooms early and is just crazy with color. *ItSaul Plants; hybridized by Richard Saul.*

USES

This is simply perfect for containers and smaller spaces in beds and borders—anywhere a heavy-blooming, summer perennial is needed.

GROWER NOTES

The following information is based on our own experience with this crop in the Pacific Northwest. Growth will vary depending on location, climate, growing medium and cultural practices. As always, where chemical use is involved, read the labels, follow the instructions and practice careful trialing methods.

- Transplant in full sun.
- Plant plug even with the soil line.
- Follow with a drench to control *Phytophthora* and *Pythium*.
- Because this cultivar is naturally compact and heavy blooming, growth regulators are usually not required to increase basal branching or control height.
- There are no major pests, but keep an eye out for aphids and leaf miners.
- Flower color may vary slightly depending on temperature and light levels.
- Plant mature, vernalized plugs in spring to provide a faster turn and simpler growing than with planting in the fall.

- Bloom time: Jun–Oct
- USDA Zone: 5(-20°)

APPROXIMATE FINISH TIMES

- Gallon from 72-cell liner: 10 weeks before first hard frost; finish in mid-June
- Gallon from 72-cell liner: 12–14 weeks from spring transplant
