## Heuchera Petite Series

### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This series brings us small *Heucheras* with beautiful foliage color and large blossoms. Bred from the western alpine wild species and garden hybrids, these will do well anywhere there is good drainage and protection from really hot sun. These are choice plants for small spaces.

- **'Petite Marbled Burgundy'**—Scalloped leaves are marbled with silver and show off masses of pink and white bellflowers.
- **'Petite Pearl Fairy'**—Rounded bronze leaves are accented by pink bellflowers.

### USES

These will thrive in a rockery, at the front of a border or in woodland gardens.

### GROWER NOTES

*The following information is based on our own experience with this crop in the Pacific Northwest. Growth will vary depending on location, climate, growing medium and cultural practices. As always, where chemical use is involved, read the labels, follow the instructions and practice careful trialing methods.*

- Plant in light shade, cool temperatures and soil rich in organic matter.
- Avoid planting into soils with a high nitrogen starter charge, or during periods of high temperature.
- When transplanting outdoors in the fall, allow sufficient time to establish roots and harden off prior to first freeze (about 6–8 weeks in most climates).
- Monitor root development and fertility levels early in production to avoid excess salts and root problems. Use a preventive drench with a broad-spectrum fungicide directly after planting.
- There are several different fungi that may cause leaf spots on *Heuchera*, and occasionally powdery mildew may be a problem. Particularly in rainy or very humid weather, use preventive, broad-spectrum fungicide sprays.

- USDA Zone: 4(-30°)

### APPROXIMATE FINISH TIMES

- Gallon from 72-cell liner: 12–14 weeks from spring transplant
- Gallon from 72-cell liner: 24–28 weeks from fall transplant
