



## Polemonium San Juan Skies

### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This little treasure was discovered on Lopez Island in Washington State, growing on a cliff with direct exposure to salt spray and fierce winds. San Juan Skies is the most compact and tidy *Polemonium* we have ever grown. The original seed collected from that plant has continued to produce a tough, compact, sweet little plant. Medium blue flowers with a yellow and white eye are borne in clusters just a few inches above the foliage.

### USES

San Juan Skies is perfect placed in the front of a perennial border or in an alpine rock garden.

### GROWER NOTES

*The following information is based on our own experience with this crop in the Pacific Northwest. Growth will vary depending on location, climate, growing medium and cultural practices. As always, where chemical use is involved, read the labels, follow the instructions and practice careful trialing methods.*

- Grow in full sun.
- In spring, transplant when night temperatures are consistently above freezing.
- Use a fast-draining soil mix of moderate fertility.
- Use a fungicide drench directly after planting.
- Growth regulators should not be needed.

### PLANT DATA

- Height: 9–12"/12"
- Spread: 18"
- Bloom time: Jun–Sep
- USDA Zone: 4(-30°)

### APPROXIMATE FINISH TIMES

- 4" from 128-cell liner: 4–6 weeks from transplant
- Gallon from 128-cell liner: 8–10 weeks from spring transplant
- Gallon from 128-cell liner: 6–8 weeks from spring transplant if planted two plants per pot
